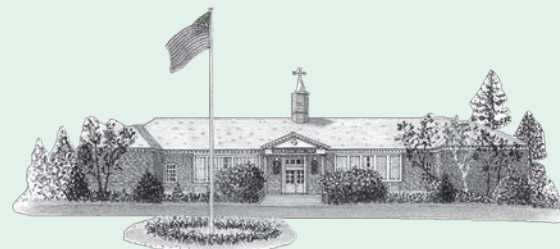

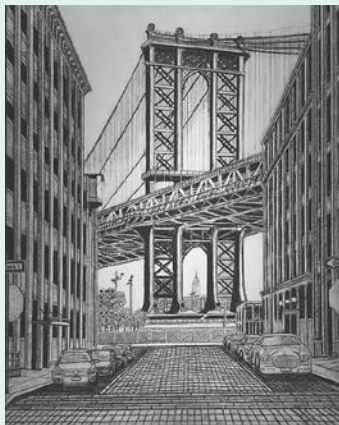
### Outdoor Drive-In Movie: THE BOSS BABY

Car Judging begins at 7:30 PM, Movie Showing 8:00 PM

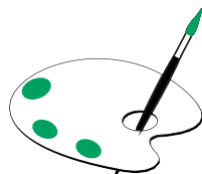

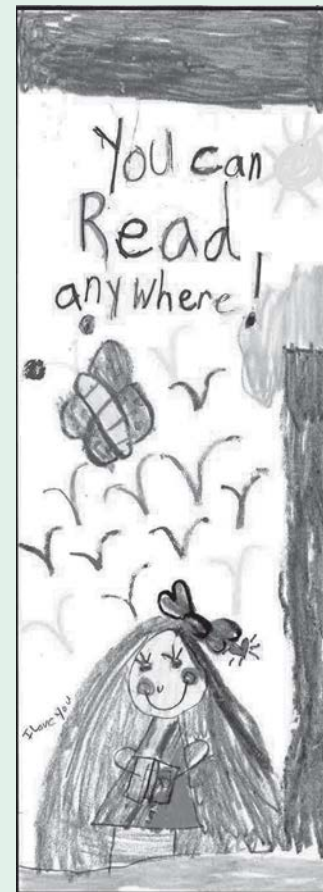
